## Cats News

With eleven cats going out and five coming in, leaves us with 25 cats in care, plus the 10 farm cats means that we have 35 mouths to feed every day.

Thank you all for donating food especially in the trolleys at **Kidsgrove TESCO and Alsager ASDA**, which has helped us enormously. **THANK YOU ALL.** 

I think many people will have heard of **TESCO** TESS, a black cat living on **TESCO** car park in the bushes, being fed by a kind lady every day, and numerous others feeding her too. We received so many appeals for help, we baited the trap and with the help of MICHELLE our friend who is a scan angel, and also the kind lady who fed her every day coupled with perseverance and patience, TESS was

eventually caught and taken to one of our fosterers. She turned out to be an affectionate cat, not chipped, but obviously had been someone's cat. Noone has come forward to claim her, sadly. We believe she is spayed, and is part way through her vaccination programme ready for re-homing.

The microchip is invaluable when tracing an owner, but sometimes **FACEBOOK** helps too. One morning we were called out to a stray cat in distress, only to find an old cat suffering from hypothermia and dehydration. No chip! She was taken immediately to the vet and treated for her condition. She was also put on **FACEBOOK** and it wasn't long before the owner came forward.

Yes, **FACEBOOK** saved **TINKER** that day, but if she had been chipped, would have been far better.

Whilst we are on the subject of MICROCHIPS, we were called out to scan a stray German Shepherd dog recently, it had a chip, but the implanter had not registered the dogs details, so the dog could not be reunited straight away to its owner. It's a good idea to ask the vet occasionally to check the chip (sometimes they move about the body).

We were only too happy to help with a cat which a neighbour had been feeding since the cats owner had passed away. Recently the cat started to look unwell, so we collected him to check him out and found he was not neutered or chipped and had injuries which were undoubtedly caused by fighting. Now he is neutered and chipped and has returned to the neighbour. He was also **FIV** tested and thank goodness, was negative.

Hopefully now, once his testosterone levels have dropped the fighting will stop.

We have many cats and kittens needing homes. **COSTA** a beautiful black kitten who is the last of the litter.

**MEGAN** – a tortie, and her sister **TASHA** – tortie & white, are both delightful, affectionate sisters who are used to living in the house and garden, as it is cat-proofed. They answer to their names and are happy living with other ats.

ALBA – a black female
VELMA – a black long
hair female
RALPHY – a tabby male
GENIE – a tabby long hair,
hopefully will go with their
mother SASHA (tabby) as
they are a bonded pair.

twins with lovely sleek black coats and bright green eyes. They are a stunning pair who love to play and give kisses.

**ARCHIE** – a lovely cream

British short hair, he has had a bad reaction to his first vaccination so is under review before he has his second one. He has now come round a treat after his matted coat was sorted, he has also now been neutered. FREDDY from Fenton, with his pillow foot, continues to make progress and will shortly be looking for a home. This lovely tabby boy deserves the best after being left to live on the streets, as so many sadly are
